## Letter from the CEO

Dear respected LIFE supporter:

Thanks to the generous support of our donors and partners, in 2017 Life successfully implemented several projects in 27 countries across Asia, Africa, the Middle East, the Caribbean and America. Whether an area was hit by natural disasters like Hurricanes Harvey and Irma in the US or Maria in Puerto Rico or war and violence as in Syria, Yemen, Iraq and the Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh LIFE staff responded by bringing needed emergency relief and support to affected families. LIFE also provided medical supplies and medical equipment to hospitals and clinics and hosted hearing aid mission trips to the Middle East.

With the belief that education is the foundation for promoting development, prosperity and peace, LIFE in collaboration with its partners, distributed books and educational materials to learning institutions ranging from grade schools to universities. We also provided school supplies and backpacks to thousands of students. In the area of community development, Life completed construction on three centers and LIFE dug water wells that provide a continuous supply of clean water to areas in several countries where water resources are scare.

Orphan sponsorship is one of our oldest and most precious programs. This initiative was started back in the early 1990s and continues today. As a result of natural calamities and wars, the number of orphans needing support continues to grow. This year, our traditional seasonal projects on Ramadan and Eid Al-Adha were stronger than prior years.

LIFE continues to reach more needy individuals and families throughout the world. We could not have achieved these results without the generosity and continued support of our friends, donors and partners.

I would like to acknowledge the staff that was instrumental in implementing these projects, some at great risk to their lives. I also thank the LIFE Board of Directors for their contributions and stewardship.

#### **Mission Statement**

### **Organizational Background**

Life for Relief and Development is a non-profit humanitarian charity founded in 1992 by concerned American professionals in response to the humanitarian crises that developed in Iraq as a result of the 1991 Gulf War. Due to the great generosity of donors, Life has been able to distribute over \$470 million in humanitarian assistance items around the world, and in the process, kindly touched millions of lives.

# **Emergency Response**

Life provided emergency food, clean water, bedding and blankets, hygiene kits, first aid kits, medicines, medical supplies & equipment for families affected by war and natural disasters.

In 2017, Life provided emergency humanitarian relief and services valued at nearly \$783,000 to people affected by the drought in Kenya, Sudan and Somalia, the Rohingya refugee crisis in Bangladesh, the landslides in Sierra Leone, the conflict in Mosul Iraq and hurricanes Harvey in Texas, Irma in Florida and Maria in Puerto Rico.

# Health Programs

Life provided hearing aids to hearing impaired poor, needy and refugees and distributed donated medicines, medical supplies and medical equipment to underserved hospitals and clinics in need.

In 2017, Life provided medicines, medical aid and equipment valued at over \$431,000 to the hearing impaired, disabled, hospitals and clinics in Jordan, Palestine, Pakistan and the Ukraine.

# **Education Programs**

Life promotes literacy through the distribution of books to colleges, universities, primary and secondary schools, donates classroom furniture to schools in need, gives orphans and poor school children uniforms, shoes, and school bags filled with stationary, pens, and other educational items through its back to school program.

In 2017, Life provided school bags to students, furniture and educational materials to schools, colleges and universities valued at over \$2.5 million in Canada, Mali, Syria and to Native American and non-profit schools and colleges in the USA.

# <u>Community/Human Development</u>

Life builds community centers where community members can gather for social events as well as funds small human development projects in Africa for poor families to enable them to start their own businesses and support their families and provides vegetable seeds to poor farmers.

Life implemented small human development projects in Uganda and Ghana and provided Drug Awareness training for communities in the USA.

# Orphan Sponsorship/Social Programs

Life's orphan sponsorship program provided food, shelter, education and healthcare to over 4,500 orphans in Afghanistan, Ghana, Haiti, Iraq, Jordan and Syria.

Over \$1.35 million in Orphan Sponsorship and Family Assistance given to aid orphans and to distribute financial and in-kind assistance in the USA for refugees and the poor and needy.

### Water/Sanitation Programs

In 2017, Life donors provided over \$135,000 to fund the construction of water wells in Ethiopia, Kenya, Senegal, Somalia and Bangladesh.

# Seasonal Projects

Life spent over \$732,000 on its seasonal projects in 2017, which helped feed thousands of needy families in many countries throughout the world.

### Ramadan

During Ramadan 2017, Life distributed food baskets to over 800,000 poor and needy individuals. Each basket contained enough food items to meet the needs of a family of 5-7 for one month easing the financial burden on the family. All items were procured locally in each country to help boost the local economy.

Life distributed food baskets to thousands of needy families and provided Iftar meals and Eid holiday gifts to poor children and orphans in Afghanistan, Ghana, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Mexico, Pakistan, Palestine, Sierra Leone, Syria, Yemen and the USA.

### Udhiya/Qurbani

In many countries, families wait in anticipation for Eid to arrive so they can receive fresh meat. Many families are so poor they cannot afford to buy meat at all during the entire year and Eidul-Adha is the only time that they have the opportunity to eat meat.

In 2017, Life distributed fresh meat packages to over 601,000 individuals in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Egypt, Ghana, Haiti, India, Iraq, Jordan, Kenya, Lebanon, Mali, Pakistan, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Turkey, Uganda, the USA, the West Bank and Gaza.
